





# The Value in Adjoining Landowner Communications

today's world, the land survey professional, enjoys an abundance of digital tools at our disposal. With a few quick clicks of the mouse we can look up; deeds, tax parcel data, aerial imagery, LIDAR, DTM surfaces, roads, creeks, USGS Quad maps, and much more from the convenience of our office chairs. In most regions, prior to visiting a site, we can determine what the property looks like, the tree canopy, and the ability to use GPS or drones to help assist in the survey. We can easily bundle a field package for the field crews to execute the required scope with little chance of them missing something that may result in an additional unnecessary site visit. All this is possible because of our ability to meticulous pre-plan, using digital resources and develop detailed instructions based on that planning.

However, there is one part of pre-planning that I see missed or skipped by my fellow surveyors over and over. The step often overlooked, is adjoining landowner communications. In Kentucky, (and many neighboring states) surveyors have the right to enter adjoining landowners' property to complete our surveys. I have heard this referred to as our "right" to trespass. While that is somewhat true, KY Code 322.470 does spell out some specific rules regarding our right to enter. Most importantly, article 3 "A professional land surveyor shall make reasonable effort to notify adjoining landowners upon whose land it is necessary to enter." Not only is this a requirement before entering upon neighboring lands, this common courtesy often opens a treasure trove of information not normally available to us. It is our policy at Enersury, to send a notification letter to ALL adjoining landowners when we undertake a new boundary project (Sample letter attached). This letter

serves as both a notification, and an inquiry for information which may help us complete the survey in a more efficient manner.

I have spent many hours talking to adjoining owners who "know exactly" where the boundary line is. This sometimes leads in some wasted time, but often results in some real time savings if they can indeed show you an actual corner marker or possession lines not clearly visible. Opening the lines of communication with adjoining owners can also reveal parol evidence for boundary lines previously agreed upon, or further deed research into possible easements. While sometimes this parol evidence cannot be confirmed, we have found it is not that hard to corroborate verbal agreements once you know they exist. It is not uncommon for an adjoining owner to produce a previous survey of either our property, or of the adjoining property, that we did not know existed prior to our letters being received. Since most counties in Kentucky do not have recording requirements regarding survey plats, knowing when a survey exists can be exceedingly difficult.

Finally, the hidden benefit that we enjoy the most is that we gain additional customers by sending out these letters. I would estimate that these letters result in additional surveys over 25% of the time. We can often create huge efficiencies in executing additional surveys in the same area we are currently working, or have previously worked in. In short, if not already doing so, I urge all our fellow surveyors to make landowner communications a required step in project execution. Your clients, your field crews, and perhaps even your bank accounts will thank you!

# SAMPLE LETTER TO ADJOING OWNERS

RE: Property Boundary Survey

**Adjoining Owner** 

1234 Gobblers Knob

Anywhere, KY 41144

Dear Mr. Owner,

On or after 09/11/17, we will be surveying the property of XXXXXX. Greenup County tax assessment and deed records indicate that you may share a common boundary with XXXXXX. We may need to expand our search for property corners beyond XXXXXX property in order to ascertain the property boundary location and to be sure the rights of all owners are considered and protected. We will be acquiring copies of deeds, surveys, and maps on record at the Greenup County Courthouse. To assure a complete and accurate survey, we would appreciate a copy of any unrecorded documents such as plats, old deeds, survey notes, reports, and similar documents that are in your possession that may help re-establish the common boundary you share with XXXXXX. We will reimburse you for any reasonable costs associated with copies to be made or will scan or take photos of the documents ourselves so that you do not have to be burdened with making those copies. If you have any pertinent information regarding boundary markers or other objects that may be hidden from view or are not easily identified as a corner or boundary marker, please let us know.

During the execution of our survey, wooden stakes and nails will be used as traverse and reference points only. These are for our use only and are not indicative of actual boundary lines or boundary corners. Once our final boundary determinations are made, we will monument and mark all set property corners with a 36" long 5/8" diameter reinforcing rod with a plastic cap inscribed with our name and Surveying license number, driven down flush with the ground. Any trees used as corners will be marked and will have pink "Boundary Line" flagging around them in triplicate. Any recovered Boundary monuments will likewise be flagged with "Boundary Line" flagging. From time to time, we may have to enter upon your property to gather information and locate evidence related to the property line. We assure you that we will not damage or disrespect your property should we need to enter upon it. Measuring on your side of the boundary is often necessary to ensure that all information and evidence is considered before making final boundary determinations. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any information or questions concerning our survey.

# **KENTUCKY CODE**

322.470 Right of entry on land of others by land surveyor -- Notification of landowner -- Liability of landowner. As used in this section, "professional land surveyor" shall include the agents, the employees, and any personnel under the supervision of a professional land surveyor. (1) A professional land surveyor may go on, over, and upon the lands of others if necessary, to perform surveys for the location of property corners, boundary lines, rights-of-way, and easements, and may carry with them their customary equipment and vehicles. (a) Entry under the right hereby granted shall not constitute trespass; and (b) A professional land surveyor shall not be liable to arrest or a civil action by reason of this entry. (2) Nothing in this section shall be construed as giving authority to a professional land surveyor to destroy, injure, damage, or move anything on the lands of another without the written permission of the landowner; and nothing in this section shall be construed as removing civil liability for these damages. (3) A professional land surveyor shall make reasonable effort to notify adjoining landowners upon whose land it is necessary to enter. (4) No owner or occupant of the land shall be liable for any injury or damage sustained by any person entering upon his or her land under the provisions of this section.

# KAPS Legislative Committee Report

09/11/2020

This report is an organizational document to gauge areas of concern KAPS wants to address in the coming years. Once solidified, these concerns can be arranged as short term or long term goals and a plan can be developed on how to approach these items.

Past considered initiatives:

CPD Hours increase. KAPS polled members and found more licensees were not in favor of increased hours than were in favor. Of note on this matter is that the "NCEES Continuing Professional Competency Standards" is recommended for 15 hours per year. This might be something that we want to re-visit as mobility of license becomes a more prominent topic. Practice of surveying definition to include the teaching of boundary surveying material. Of note on this point is the NCEES "Position Statement" 12 in which NCEES encourages that all faculty teaching advanced engineering courses be licensed professionals. Kentucky has this concept for engineering within the state laws. However, this is not addressed for surveying either at the NCEES level or the state law level.

Plat Recording Law. We have looked at this one

several times - and had a consensus from the KAPS BOD members at one time that we would like to move forward. If this is something the board of directors wishes to pursue, we have a fair amount of background info from various states to work from. Surveying core curriculum language change concerning required hours. Currently, a student could potentially take no boundary surveying courses and meet the stated required hours. Could this lead to challenging any decision to not allow licensure based on no boundary content? Language changes which would require at least one or preferably two courses (6 semester hours) in boundary specific study might be worth pursuing. Although surveying covers a wide path, protection of the public's property boundaries is the heart of the licensure idea.

What are your thoughts on the items above or what



additional concerns do you think KAPS should be looking to address?



# GIAC Liaison Report—

2022 Datum and the New State Plane Coordinate System Design

The Kentucky GIAC and the GIAC State Plane Coordinate Subcommittee has been hard at work developing the new standards and specifications for the Kentucky State Plane Coordinate Systems to be released in the future. These changes are due to the new NGS 2022 coordinate system revisions. The committee and GIAC are currently working on both KAR and KRS revisions to enact these recommended changes.

Numerous agencies and individuals are present on this subcommittee to ensure a broad agreement is met between involved parties. KAPS has been involved with the inception of the subcommittee by the representation of Tim Tong, PLS. Quarterly meeting have been occurring since last fall, even through the pandemic, with the aid of online meeting platforms.

The committee has recommended changes in the Kentucky Single Zone system as well as developing multiple low distortion projection systems (LDP) that will be very advantageous to surveyors utilizing GPS and conventional surveying techniques and the same project, by mitigating the grid to ground differences found in the current systems.



\*Descriptions taken from the KAPS By-Laws / Article III / Section 2 Classifications and Qualifications

**FULL MEMBER:** Full Membership shall be granted, upon application to the Board, to <u>any person licensed to practice</u> <u>land surveying in the Commonwealth of Kentucky</u>. Except as otherwise hereinafter provided, such membership shall continue, as long as the person's rights to practice land surveying is maintained. A Full Member shall enjoy all rights and privileges of membership in KAPS.

- **LIFETIME FULL MEMBER**: Lifetime Full Membership shall be granted upon conditions listed above with one lump sum payment equal to 20 years of the current Full Member dues rate.
- FIRST LICENSED YEAR: KAPS offers Full Membership free of charge to newly licensed individuals.

**ASSOCIATE MEMBER:** Any <u>person who is non-licensed but has an interest in land surveying</u> shall be eligible for Associate Membership in KAPS. Associate Membership shall be granted upon recommendation by a Full Member and application to the Board. An Associate Member shall have all rights of Full Membership except the rights to vote and hold office.

**CORPORATE MEMBER:** Any <u>firm or organization engaged in the practice of land surveying</u> shall be eligible for Corporate Membership provided that either a principal of the firm or a person in responsible management position of surveying for the firm is a Full Member of KAPS. Corporate Membership shall be granted upon application to and majority approval by the Board. Corporate Members shall only have such rights or privileges as may hereinafter be provided or which may be accorded at the discretion of the Board. Corporate Members may enroll full-time employees as KAPS members under the appropriate category at a 20% discount from the full price.

**BUSINESS MEMBER:** Any <u>firm or organization who is non-licensed but has an interest in land surveying</u> shall be eligible for Business Membership in KAPS. Business Membership shall be granted upon recommendation by a Full Member and application to the Board. A Business Member shall only have such rights or privileges as may hereinafter be provided or which may be accorded at the discretion of the Board. Business Members may enroll full-time employees as KAPS members under the appropriate category at a 20% discount from the full price.

**STUDENT MEMBER:** Any <u>full-time student with an interest in the profession of land surveying</u> shall be eligible for Student Membership. Membership shall be granted upon application and approval of the Board of Directors. Student Members shall have all rights of membership except the rights to vote and hold office, except within a Student Chapter.
