

It is with great sadness that I share the passing of land surveyor, Jim Krauth. Our thoughts and prayers are with the Krauth family.



A BRIEF UPDATE FROM YOUR APPALACHIAN REGIONAL ADVISOR AT NGS: JEFF JALBRZIKOWSKI

Back in July of this year a Federal Register Notice (FRN) was published by the National Geodetic Survey (NGS) that discusses one of the technical aspects of our forthcoming new datums. A link to that FRN will be at the end of this article for anyone interested in reading it in full, but I'd like to provide a brief summary.

With the new datums will come a new database of geodetic control. I have heard of some misconceptions that this database will begin from scratch, but this is not the case. The new database will initially be populated with control data from both our NGS IDB (Integrated Database) and OPUS Share database. The future vertical datum slated for 2022 (NAPGD2022) will not be a leveling-based datum, but solely comprised of GNSS/GPS observations only. This means that existing leveled control data will not migrate to the new database. There is a "catch" to this, however.


Personnel at NGS have analyzed hundreds of thousands of GNSS vectors in the IDB and believe that some older data should not be migrated to the new database, in turn being used to develop initial **reference epoch** coordinates for NATRF/NAPGD2022. It seems that the older GNSS data, being single frequency or perhaps based on immature satellite orbit data, does not significantly contribute to the network, rather weakens it. As a result of this, our geodesists are considering imposing an age limit (or cutoff date) for GNSS observations that will be migrated to the future

database. That means that a portion of the existing control in your area, even if based on GNSS, *might* not end up getting new coordinates in the new datums, depending on official cut off dates still to be determined. The experiments to make a final decision and determine a cutoff date (if one is needed), have yet to be performed. But the subject FRN has provided some insights into possibilities.


While the cutoff date is undetermined, it is unlikely that it will be fewer than 10 years before the initial reference epoch of NATRF/NAPGD2022, which is set as 01 January 2020 (typically expressed as 2020.0000 in geodetic or astronomic applications). What does this mean? Simply put, any GNSS observations in either of our databases that were collected before 01 January 2020 would not be used for the new datum developments. Remember, per the FRN this 10 years prior cutoff date is a "worst case" scenario and the cutoff date might end up being older. So, what would the Kentucky database look like if the cutoff date is set as 01 January 2010?

I've included a map that illustrates IDB marks in yellow and OPUS Share marks in green, and only marks with observations collected between January 2010 and May 2019 are shown. This gives a pretty good idea of the impact of a January 2010 cutoff date. Note that the Pikeville area looks pretty good, and the Lexington area looks really good due to the recent LFUCG control


network submitted to NGS just last year.

Conversely, there are a number of counties left with no NGS published control. I don't know the impact of this to the surveying community so that's why I wanted to share it. Perhaps the vast majority of folks are okay with this, as they utilize the KY-CORS RTN, and if that's the case then there's nothing to be concerned with.

If you are concerned with what control will be left in your area, once the new datums are

implemented, there are options. To get a mark "updated" (or newly entered into one of our databases) you would need to perform two static GNSS sessions of 4 hours each, take photos of the mark and your receiver setup, upload the data to OPUS-Static, then choose the option to "share my solution". It's pretty straightforward and we have a 10 minute OPUS Share tutorial video; I will have a

link to that at the end of this article.

You could also submit your data to us via OPUS Projects if you've been trained on it, which I want to mention will soon have the capability to integrate your RTK and RTN data. Do note that whichever option you choose, the deadline to submit your observations to NGS is 31 December 2021. Drop me a line, I'd be happy to talk (or email) with you about this, or anything else related to the forthcoming new datums.

Sidenote: What is a reference epoch? Each realization of NAD 83 is based on a certain reference epoch, or a specific instant in time that coordinates are referenced to. To see this take a look at the datasheet for PID [AC6044](#). Just below the current NAD 83(2011) positions you will find "EPOCH" and a decimal date of 2010.00 which is the reference epoch for the current 2011 realization of NAD 83. The epoch of 2020.00 will be the initial reference epoch of our new datums (NATRF2022 and NAPGD2022).





STANDARD OF CARE IN RESEARCH

WHERE TO DRAW THE LINE

A recent, and probably familiar scenario with a client, has prompted me to take a closer look at 201KAR 18:150, for some clarification, I previously thought I had straight in my head. Upon completion and imparting of the deliverables, a client returned to us with a catalogue of easements that were part of a title opinion, we were not privy to, during the field work. They subsequently wanted us to address each item on the survey. Typical contractual wrangling then ensued. Our stance being, we proposed a boundary survey to the requirements of 201KAR 18:150 and addressing items from a title opinion were not part of the original fee. This brought me to question, when a survey is ordered by a less sophisticated client, or one that would not typically involve a provided title opinion, what is “adequate” or standard of care, when it comes to research of easements?

For the practicing surveyor, the requirements of accuracy, corner monumentation, field survey procedures, and so on, are the benchmarks of any project from quotation to completion. However, what exactly is required in the courthouse, is where, for me anyway, it starts to get more subjective. It is important to note that the focus of my original inquiry was centered on easement research. What is adequate research for determining limits of ownership, is best discussed at another time. Only to say I have made it a practice to run the subject property to its source deed. Please, feel free to send in submissions on the matter, always looking for content. For this article, however, I would like to pose the question about the surveyor’s liability regarding records typically only discovered through the course of a third-party title opinion. Is our liability solely dependent on what is provided by the client? If no title opinion is provided, does this indemnify the surveyor from records that are

discovered only by a cross check of all previous owners back to the original owner or over a certain amount of time?

After reading through many other State Regulations, there is a certain amount of consensus that any “visual” evidence of access, ingress and egress, visible utilities, and so on, should be graphically depicted and addressed on a plat of survey. Also, any platted easements related to previous record plats, or as part of the deed of transfer, are expected to be part of a Plat of Survey. But, what about one of those “...across the lands of....” type easements, granted three owners back, to a utility company that no longer has fixtures on the property?

Let us first go to what our own Kentucky Statutes say. Surprisingly, the word “easement” does not even show up until the section on Mortgage Inspections. In Section 5 (Record Research), sub section (3), it speaks to “.... all relevant documents...”, and subsection (5), again states “Any other available data or documents pertinent to the boundary survey.” Would said blanket easement three owners back be pertinent to location property lines on the ground? Probably not. However, the language leaves room for interpretation.

When we look at the Standard of Practice Regulations for our neighbors to the south, the RULES OF TENNESSEE STATE BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR LAND SURVEYORS, Section 0820-03-06(8) states, “Easements evidenced by Record Documents which have been delivered to the Land Surveyor shall be shown, both those burdening and those benefiting the property surveyed, indicating recording information....” It goes on to speak to observable evidence, which coincides with the consensus that “if you can see it, show it on the plat.” It is the “delivered

to the Land Surveyor," that seems to be missing from the Kentucky Statutes. If this wording protects the surveyor's liability or not when a title opinion is not delivered, is hard to say. It at least gives the surveyor a legal leg to stand on the Kentucky Statutes do not.

Alabama's Society of Professional Land Surveyors, take it one step further in their **STANDARDS OF PRACTICE FOR SURVEYING IN THE STATE OF ALABAMA**, Section 10 (b) " All easements and rights of way to be shown on the survey must have documentation provided to the surveyor by the client or client's representative. No sub-surface features are required to be located unless information of their existence and location is furnished to the surveyor by the client." "Must have documentation provided," is substantially clearer, and most likely born of situations that exposed surveyor liability.


The New York State Office of Professions Land Surveying Practice Guidelines, Section 5(A)(1), dances around the issue when it states what is required of a boundary survey plat,

"Exceptions, easements, encumbrances, rights of way, privileges, restrictions and reversions affecting the client property or access to the same in so far as they affect, the professional determinations to be made by the surveyor.

Note: None of the above is intended to require the surveyor to perform the title search. It is common practice for the surveyor to rely on title search information prepared by others qualified to do so."

Certainly, a wide range of subjective examples are to be found, when one reviews state regulations across the country. Should Kentucky Surveyors have clearer and less subjective language in the Kentucky State Statutes, when it comes to required research? If we did, would it prove protective in a litigation situation? It could not hurt to have this conversation at least.

In the meantime, the communication with the client

becomes paramount to limiting your liability, and not to mention your profit margin. What is not specifically spelled out regarding research and standard of care in the state statutes, should be specifically named in proposals, drawings, and reports. The lost art of the surveyor's report can also be a valuable medium in communicating to the client what are the limitations and expectations of a boundary survey. The clearest way I have seen it conveyed to this point, is as follows:

The services provided do not include and should not be construed to be an opinion on the title. A record search performed as part of the surveying services does not substitute for a title search and a title search by a title abstractor does not substitute for a record search by a surveyor. While boundary information is often found in title documents, the examination of the same document by the title examiner and surveyor is different. Title abstractors look at the parties, interest conveyed, the intent of the parties, recital, type of deed, consideration, dates of execution, etc. A surveyor looks at the description of the property and other spatial data bearing on boundaries or use of the land (e.g., easements). A poor description often passes good title while a good description may not necessarily pass good title. Often boundary information is found in plats, miscellaneous records,

neighboring deeds, etc. These records are seldom examined by a title abstractor. Furthermore, title abstractors usually limit the time period encompassed by a title search back 40 years or less from the present time period. On the other hand, surveyors will often search back in time for a century or more to the first description of the boundary in order to get original information and identify omissions or blunders in the current boundary description.

As a result of the record research, an opinion on the record boundary is presented. An opinion on your title must be obtained from an experienced real estate attorney.

Stay in Touch

Every year, hundreds of individual PE and PLS licenses and Business Entity Permits are not renewed. In many cases, this is unintentional. There are a variety of reasons why this can happen.

- Licensees often have renewal notices sent to their work address, but fail to inform us when they leave the firm.
- Employees at some firms delegate license and firm renewals to a clerical employee in the office, even providing that employee's email address instead of their own. This can be a problem when that employee leaves the firm or their job duties change.
- Licensees who list their home address as their default address sometimes fail to notify the board when they move. They might submit a change of address form to the Post Office, assuming their renewal notice will be forwarded. But USPS Forwarding Orders expire after six months, so depending on the timing, a renewal notice sent to a licensee's old address might not be forwarded.

Licensees sometimes provide only the minimum contact information to the board, leaving the board with no means of contacting a licensee when the default address is no longer valid.

Here are some tips to help you stay in touch and keep your license status current...

Maintain control over your license renewals. If you delegate this task to someone else, have a procedure in place to make sure it is done properly and on time. It is also important to remember that a license renewal is an application in which certain important questions must be answered. The licensee is responsible for the accuracy of these answers regardless of who completes the form.

Mark your calendar to keep track of when your individual license and business entity permit (if

applicable) expires.

Carefully consider which address to provide to the board as your "default" address for official correspondence. While our system can record multiple addresses (home, work, etc...), the default address you provide is the only address to which renewal notices are mailed.

Provide an email address. While the board still uses USPS for renewal notices, we are beginning to use email for second notices and for other important communications. The use of email will likely increase in the future. Email addresses provided to the board are not published.

Provide phone numbers, including a cell phone number. Thanks to phone number "portability", a cell phone number can potentially be the most enduring method of contact. Many people keep the same cell phone number for years regardless of where they move. Cell phone numbers provided to the board are not published.

Periodically check and update your contact information, especially when you move or have a change in employment. You can check your contact information at our online searchable roster at: <https://elsweb.kyboels.ky.gov/kweb/Searchable-Roster>.






Late Individual Renewals

If you missed the June 30 renewal deadline for renewal of your individual PE and/or PLS license (odd number years for A-K and even number years for L-Z), you have up to one year to renew using the online renewal system. The system will automatically calculate a 10% per month late renewal penalty. Please be aware that anyone who renews on or after September 1 of his or her renewal year is subject to an automatic continuing education audit.

The late renewal provision notwithstanding, practice on an expired license is prohibited. While your license is expired, you cannot practice, offer to practice, or represent to the public that you are a professional engineer or professional land surveyor. Each of these acts constitutes unlicensed practice and can result in disciplinary action.

Any licensee whose license remains in expired status for more than one year must apply for reinstatement before returning to active practice.

For all these reasons, please renew timely. You can always check your license status and contact information using our online searchable roster at:

Also, please mark your own calendar so you know when your firm and/or individual renewals are due. Even though we send a Renewal Notice in the mail, you are solely responsible for ensuring that your license(s) and permit(s) are renewed in a timely

manner.

response to this need. It provides an easier and faster way to complete the licensure process in multiple jurisdictions, including all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, Northern Mariana Islands, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. An established NCEES Record will include most—if not all—of the materials you need to apply for comity licensure in additional states and territories.

More than two thirds of PE and PLS licensing jurisdictions across the US and its territories now accept the NCEES Record in satisfaction of all or nearly all of the information required to apply for a PE or PLS license. In these states, the NCEES Record lets you eliminate having to resubmit your college transcripts, exam results, employment verifications, and professional references every time you apply.

If you were licensed in Kentucky in the last few years, you already have an NCEES record. If you don't have an NCEES Record and want to apply for licensure in an additional U.S. state or territory, consider applying for an NCEES Record. NCEES will review your materials and, after your Record is established, electronically submit them directly to the licensing board on your behalf. This saves time and simplifies the application process when you need to practice in multiple states and territories.


FIROOZ ZANDI, PE

In 2019, the Board of Licensure received notification from the Indiana Board that Firooz Zandi, a resident of Indiana, and a licensee in both Indiana and Kentucky, had been convicted by a court of law, of a felony of *Theft of Property Having a Value in Excess of \$50,000.00*. In an August 14, 2020 Order, the Indiana State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers Indefinitely Suspended Zandi's Indiana license. Mr. Zandi's felony conviction was directly

related to his professional engineering practice, and therefore constituted a violation of KRS 322.180 (7). When Board staff entered into settlement negotiations with Mr. Zandi, he chose to surrender his Kentucky PE license instead of going to an Administrative Hearing. His voluntary surrender of his license was presented to the Board of Licensure through a Consent Decree, which the Board accepted on October 23, 2020.

On September 10, 2019, the New York Board of Engineering, Land Surveying, and Geology, entered an Order against James Clancy for two counts of professional misconduct, for sharing his engineering fees with a non-licensed individual and for signing off on a letter of completion for a construction project, without thoroughly reviewing the work, which had been done by someone else. His New York license was suspended for two years, with the suspension stayed while his license was placed on a two-year probation. After an investigation was initiated, it was discovered that during both his 2009 and 2011 renewals in Kentucky, Mr. Clancy failed to disclose prior disciplinary actions in New Jersey and Vermont. In addition, a review of Mr. Clancy's Kentucky projects found that Clancy was certifying plans that were not prepared by him or under his direct supervision and failed to keep records of his reviews of the plans and his calculations. Finally, Mr. Clancy was operating in Kentucky without an engineering firm permit. All of these are violations of various portions of KRS 322, and 201 KAR Chapter 18. Mr. Clancy was offered a variety of penalties for the many violations, and chose instead to surrender his Kentucky PE license. His voluntary surrender was presented to the Board of Licensure through a Consent Decree, which the Board accepted on October 23, 2020.





ASSOCIATE MEMBER: Any person who is non-licensed but has an interest in land surveying shall be eligible for Associate Membership in KAPS. Associate Membership shall be granted upon recommendation by a Full Member and application to the Board. An Associate Member shall have all rights of Full Membership except the rights to vote and hold office.

CORPORATE MEMBER: Any firm or organization engaged in the practice of land surveying shall be eligible for Corporate Membership provided that either a principal of the firm or a person in responsible management position of surveying for the firm is a Full Member of KAPS. Corporate Membership shall be granted upon application to and majority approval by the Board. Corporate Members shall only have such rights or privileges as may hereinafter be provided or which may be accorded at the discretion of the Board. Corporate Members may enroll full-time employees as KAPS members under the appropriate category at a 20% discount from the full price.

BUSINESS MEMBER: Any firm or organization who is non-licensed but has an interest in land surveying shall be eligible for Business Membership in KAPS. Business Membership shall be granted upon recommendation by a Full Member and application to the Board. A Business Member shall only have such rights or privileges as may hereinafter be provided or which may be accorded at the discretion of the Board. Business Members may enroll full-time employees as KAPS members under the appropriate category at a 20% discount from the full price.

STUDENT MEMBER: Any full-time student with an interest in the profession of land surveying shall be eligible for Student Membership. Membership shall be granted upon application and approval of the Board of Directors. Student Members shall have all rights of membership except the rights to vote and hold office, except within a Student Chapter.


